## OA Week at Santee Lodge

Santee Lodge has been known for having unique events and a different way of doing things from other lodges in our Section. Our main event is a week-long fellowship, known as OA Week. OA Week starts with Check-in on a Sunday afternoon. With the Pre-Ordeal ceremony happening that same night, candidates then take on the trials and tribulations of the Ordeal on Monday. Monday night is when we have the Ordeal and Brotherhood ceremonies, along with our Cracker Barrel and introduction to the new Ordeal Members.

So what does everyone else in the lodge do while the ordeal is taking place? As Brothers, we all come together as one and partake in service around camp. From clearing brush along trails to repairing fallen structures, everyone as Brothers come together and serves our camp and council by providing Cheerful Service during this time.

After Sunday and Monday, we begin pageant practice and merit badge classes. We call it a pageant because originally it was skits that were performed, developed into stories, and now we celebrate by putting on a scripted play. We, Santee Lodge 116, are the only lodge in the nation to have such a week that is ended with a pageant, and it is spectacular! For only having five days for everyone to have their lines memorized, costumes ready, motions learned, and nerves out, we sure do put on a show! We perform our pageant at Dusk on Friday night, and everyone enjoys the recreation of Native American tales.

I mentioned Merit Badges also, but these aren't just any normal merit badges, these are more rare awards that are harder to earn. Many of these merit badges aren't offered at our annual Summer Camp program, so we give Arrowmen the opportunity to earn various merit badges such as Digital Technology, Welding, Farm Mechanics, and Engineering. We offer a chance to earn up to 4 additional merit badges that would otherwise take you a substantial amount of time to complete.

After the pageant, everyone who attended OA Week is welcome to stay for our Summer Fellowship for free. So you are able to get 2 events for the price of 1! This year, Summer Fellowship will represent our Centennial Celebration and we will be doing various activities. One such thing is a reenactment of the very first Ordeal ceremony ever performed. We were able to gain the actual script from the National OA Committee, and have a ceremony team that will be performing it.

I hope that you seriously consider attending our OA Week and Summer Fellowship, so that you are able to experience the tradition and excellence that Santee Lodge is known for.
