- * You will earn a \$4.00 discount at the following events if pre-paid at least 12 days in advance: Fall Fellowship, all ordeals, Spring Fellowship, winter banquet. Letters postmarked at least 12 days will receive the discounted fee. You can ask for a refund if you cancel a registration 12 days in advance. Candidate fee is not discounted.
- * A Candidate fee of \$46.00 is the fee for the entire weekend for anyone joining the OA.
- * The Brotherhood fee is for the brother's planning on obtaining Brotherhood at an ordeal or fellowship weekend and is in addition to the standard fee for the weekend.
- * The Brotherhood fee is \$0.00 for those members that took the ordeal in 2011 or 2012.
- * The Fall Fellowship includes 2014 dues of \$12.00.
- * The Annual Passport includes Beaver Day, All Ordeals, Spring Fellowship, Fall Fellowship, LLD and 2014 Winter Banquet and 2014 dues. Everybody buying a passport by March 1st will receive the activity patches free. A BSA health form **MUST** be turned in with your passport fee or the fee will be returned.
- * Any Ordeal Candidates completing their ordeal in 2011 or 2012 will be able to get Brotherhood free in 2013. The event Fee will still apply. Members taking the ordeal before 2011 or in another lodge will need to pay the \$15.00 fee.
- * A BSA health form will be required for each and every overnight event. The exception: You may send in a single health form when registering for several events at the SAME time, this includes those brothers buying a passport. Health Forms will not be saved unless sent with multiple registration.
- * All participants will be expected the read and sign the Lodge Code of Conduct at each and every overnight event.

Code of Conduct Eswau Huppeday Lodge

The success or failure of Eswau Huppeday Lodge depends on the conduct of each individual brother that attends. As a Scout and an Arrowman, I understand and will observe all rules and regulations of the Piedmont Council, the Order of the Arrow, the Boy Scouts of America, and will observe the reasonable demands made of me. As a member of the Order of the Arrow, I will:

- 1. Observe the Scout Law, Scout Oath, and the Obligation of the Order of the Arrow.
- 2. Wear my officially designated uniform as required throughout the event, specifically during travel to and from the event, during all ceremonies or shows, during Saturday evening supper, and during the chapel service/business meeting.
- 3. Attend the planned and general training sessions.
- 4. Confine the trading and swapping of Scout related items to free periods and in designated areas only.
- 5. Be personally responsible for the breakage, damage, or loss of property.
- 6. Observe quiet hours and lights-out hours.
- 7. Keep my quarters clean and dispose of trash in the proper places.
- 8. Register and pay for all events that I attend.
- 9. Allow no unregistered person to occupy my quarters.
- 10. Shirts and shoes will be worn at all times in accordance with BSA policy.
- 11. No alcohol or illegal drugs will be allowed on camp property.
- 12. Observe BSA tobacco use policy. .
- 13. Not to leave camp without permission of the event adult leadership.
- 14. Remember that I am a guest of Eswau Huppeday Lodge, of Piedmont Council, and Camp Bud Schiele.
- 15. Park only in designated areas unless approved. Designated areas include the activity field and the parking lot. See the adult leadership for other approved parking or driving while at camp.
- 16. Abide by the BSA Guide to Safe Scouting.

The Boy Scouts of America prohibits the use of alcoholic beverages and controlled substances at encampments or activities on property owned and/or operated by the Boy Scouts of America, or at any activity involving participation of youth members. Adult leaders should support the attitude that young adults are better off without tobacco and may not allow the use of tobacco products at any BSA activity involving youth participants.

All Scouting functions, meetings, and activities should be conducted on a smoke-free basis, with smoking areas located away from all participants.



Chapter Reports

The Oconoluftee Chapter used their June Meeting to retire flags as part of their on-going Service Project to the County. Our annual Chapter outing was held this year at Pin Station in Newton, where we participated in the "Gutterball Regatta", which is a bowling event. The winner for the Scouts was Zach Caldwell; the adult winner was Danny Mason.....and the Guttermaster was Ben Cunningham. All received a wooden patch to signify their achievement. Our Ocono-mobile, which had nothing to do with a garbage can, won the car race at Fall Fellowship. We coordinated with local veterans groups to sponcer a large Flag retirements Ceremony at L.P. Franz (Crawdads) Stadium the Saturday after Fall Fellowship. Approximately 1668 flags were decommissioned and a majority of same were retired in seven fire barrels by a crew of 60 OA brothers, Scouts and Scouters. This was our largest OA turnout ever with 29 brothers helping. A special patch was made by the Veteran's groups for those, who volunteered. The next weekend was the Murray's Mill Harvest Festival where ten Brothers helped make stools, bird houses and tool boxes for the children.......And, yes, the next weekend saw 11 more Brothers help with traffic control at the "Brett's Ride" Bicycle race in Hickory on Sunday the 7th of October. Our October meeting was the largest Chapter meeting in five years;19 youth and adults. Our November "Feast" was well attended with all sorts of foods, which could have been made by the Native Americans or the Settlers. We have at least three more service projects planned for 2012, but may add one more possibility.

New Cabin Use Policy

Due to abuse and youth protection issues that have arisen with the use of the staff cabins, the executive board of the lodge has decided that the policy for the use of the cabins be set as the following:

- 1. Only executive youth lodge officers and committee chairmen may use cabins, preregistration for event REQUIRED
- 2. Only executive lodge advisers and committee advisers may use the cabins, preregistration for event REQUIRED
- 3. Any open spaces in the cabins may be filled by adults 21 years old and older and they are assigned ONLY thru preregistration for EACH event
- 4. Adults 21 years old and older may sign up for the OPEN spaces ONLY at registration check in on the day of the event.

THERE ARE TO BE NO EXCEPTIONS TO THE ABOVE RULES. NO ONE SHOULD EVER ENTER A CABIN THAT THEY ARE NOT ASSIGNED TO OR INVITED INTO. PLEASE SEE LODGE REGISTRATION FORMS IF YOU WOULD LIKE TO BE ASSIGNED A CABIN SPACE
