
Eswau Patch History 101

- The Candidate fee is the fee for the entire weekend for anyone joining the Order of the Arrow.
- * The Brotherhood fee is for the brother's planning on obtaining Brotherhood at an ordeal or fellowship weekend and is in addition to the standard fee for the weekend.
- The Fall Fellowship includes 2011 dues of \$12.00.
- * The Annual Passport includes Beaver Day, All Ordeals, Fall Fellowship, LLD and 2011 Winter Banquet and 2011 dues. A BSA health form MUST be turned in with your passport fee or the fee will be returned.

ORDER OF THE ARROW, BOY SCOUTS OF AMERICA

Code of Conduct Eswau Huppeday Lodge

The success or failure of Eswau Huppeday Lodge depends on the conduct of each individual brother that attends. As a Scout and an Arrowman, I understand and will observe all rules and regulations of the Piedmont Council, the Order of the Arrow, the Boy Scouts of America, and will observe the reasonable demands made of me. As a member of the Order of the Arrow, I will:

- 1. Observe the Scout Law, Scout Oath, and the Obligation of the Order of the Arrow.
- 2. Wear my officially designated uniform as required throughout the event, specifically during travel to and from the event, during all ceremonies or shows, during Saturday evening supper, and during the chapel service/business meeting.
- 3. Attend the planned and general training sessions.
- 4. Confine the trading and swapping of Scout related items to free periods and in designated areas only.
- 5. Be personally responsible for the breakage, damage, or loss of property.
- 6. Observe quiet hours and lights-out hours.
- 7. Keep my quarters clean and dispose of trash in the proper places.
- 8. Register and pay for all events that I attend.
- 9. Allow no unregistered person to occupy my quarters.
- 10. Shirts and shoes will be worn at all times in accordance with BSA policy.
- 11. No alcohol or illegal drugs will be allowed on camp property.
- 12. Observe BSA tobacco use policy. .
- 13. Not to leave camp without permission of the event adult leadership.
- 14. Remember that I am a guest of Eswau Huppeday Lodge, of Piedmont Council, and Camp Bud Schiele.
- 15. Park only in designated areas unless approved. Designated areas include the activity field and the parking lot. See the adult leadership for other approved parking or driving while at camp.
- 16. Abide by the BSA Guide to Safe Scouting.

The Boy Scouts of America prohibits the use of alcoholic beverages and controlled substances at encampments or activities on property owned and/or operated by the Boy Scouts of America, or at any activity involving participation of youth members. Adult leaders should support the attitude that young adults are better off without tobacco and may not allow the use of tobacco products at any BSA activity involving youth participants.

All Scouting functions, meetings, and activities should be conducted on a smoke-free basis, with smoking areas located away from all participants.

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Fall Fellowship Raft Race

The raft race course will be announced at Fall Fellowship. Chapters should be prepared to launch their craft into the water, stay in the water for half an hour while completing tasks including carrying extra weight on their raft, and successfully get the raft back on land. Points will be given based on a chapter's placement in finishing the race and in completing tasks. The rafts may be used in other events Saturday afternoon, chapters should have a durable raft that will survive longer than one race.

Race Rules

These rules of basic raft design and rules during the race must be followed. Failure to follow these rules will result in disqualification. Each chapter will be provided with pfd's and paddles.

- 1. The raft will be made primarily of lashed wood. At least 10 Scout lashings made with rope must be present and functional on the craft. To assist with flotation, each chapter may have a combination of flotation devices equaling a volume of 25 gallons. The craft cannot be any larger than 10 feet by 10 feet. No ropes, motors, fans, or jet engines may be used to propel your cart. The raft must be propelled only by rowing with paddles.
- 2. Each Chapter must have a "crew:" two or more rowers. No substitutions will be allowed once the race begins. Each Chapter must have one "captain." The captain must remain standing on the raft and will not assist in the rowing. The captain must have some way to remain stable while standing on the raft.
- 3. All captains and rowers must wear a PFD. At no point should any member of the crew or the captain intentionally enter the water; they must stay on their raft.
- 4. Chapters may not attempt damage or flip another chapter's raft or attempt to injure another chapter's crew or captain.

Raft Spirit

These items will not affect a chapter's ability to participate in the race.

They are for points in the Best Raft Design contest.

- a. Chapter name presented clearly and correctly
- b. A flag on a pole which is mounted upright on the raft
- c. A ring buoy or lifesaving pole
- d. A fishing rod and tackle box
- e. Seats for the rowers
- f. A rubber duck
- g. Water guns any number and of any kind, can be used during race
- h. Bonus spirit up to 20 points awarded for extra embellishments and overall look

Captain Spirit - up to 20 points will be awarded for the appearance of the captain
