

PARKING AT CAMP

This year some changes are being made at Camp Bud Schiele to limit vehicles driving around camp during events. At our lodge events, we will be given special parking passes for the area parking next to the Dinning Hall and for the staff lodge parking area.

You will only receive a parking pass if you are critical to program, handicapped, or an essential member of the cook team. All other brothers must park in the main parking lot or in the activity field. Parking is not allowed in any campsite, on the shoulders of camp roads, or in any area that would prohibit access by camp rangers, camp staff, or emergency vehicles.

At Ordeal, Candidates can unload at the OA shelter but must quickly move their vehicle to the main parking or the activity field to register. Please limit any driving in camp to a minimum. A very limited number of vehicles can be used for moving brothers to work areas.

We have been asked to eliminate all driving around camp that is not essential to program. Please help us achieve this at our remaining Ordeals and all future lodge events at camp.




CHAPTER REPORTS




2018 BEAVER DAY

POLICY FOR CABIN USE.

Staff cabins are for use by Lodge Advisers, lodge officers, people with health reasons that make camping hard and for any adults. Cabin space may be reserved when you register with the treasurer adviser. Unreserved cabins will be availably first come, first served starting at 6:30 on the Friday of events. YOU MUST sign up for a cabin bunk at registration. DO NOT put your gear in a cabin before you check in assuming that space is yours! You may register for a cabin by snail mail or by email, but not by phone.

- * You will earn a \$5.00 discount at the following events if pre-paid at least 10 days in advance: Fall Fellowship, all ordeals, Spring Fellowship, winter banquet. Letters postmarked at least 10 days will receive the discounted fee. You can ask for a refund if you cancel a registration 10 days in advance. Candidate fee is not discounted.
- * The Candidate or New Member fee is \$50.00 and should be done on the Candidate registration form.
- * Any Ordeal Candidates completing their ordeal in 2016 or 2017 will be able to get Brotherhood free in 2018. The event Fee will still apply. Members taking the ordeal before 2015 or in another lodge will need to pay the \$20.00 fee.
- * The Fall Fellowship includes 2019 dues of \$12.00.
- * The Annual Passport includes Beaver Day, All Ordeals, Spring Fellowship, Fall Fellowship, LLD and 2019 Winter Banquet and 2019 dues. A BSA health form MUST be turned in with your passport fee or the fee will be returned. PASSPORT HOLDERS MUST REGISTER TO HAVE FREE BREGISTER AT BEAVER DAY, WE NEED A GOOD COUNT TO BUY THE PROPER AMOUNT OF FOOD..
- * A BSA health form will be required for each and every overnight event. The exception: You may send in a single health form when registering for several events at the SAME time, this includes those brothers buying a passport. Health Forms will not be saved unless sent with multiple registrations.
- * All participants will be expected the read and sign the Lodge Code of Conduct at each and every overnight event.
